

## Moving to Guernsey as a bus driver

Guernsey is popular with bus drivers due to its quality of life, low tax and natural beauty.

However, Guernsey is not a part of the European Union (EU) and UK employment laws do not necessarily apply. As a result, the UK and EU laws that give citizens of one EU country the right to live and work in another EU country do not apply in Guernsey.

In order to work in Guernsey, a person must be legally housed and in possession of a "Right to Work" document, which acts a little bit like a work permit. UK applicants will also need to apply for a "Right to Work" document.

The Housing Control Department of the Government in Guernsey, is likely to award non-Guernsey bus drivers either:

- a) a 1 to 3 year licence; or
- b) a 9-months on-island, 3-months off-island licence.

CT Plus Guernsey will assist you in arranging housing licences and will assist you in finding housing on the island.

Key considerations for you will be:

- Guernsey law means that your family will not be able to move to Guernsey with you.
- You will have to strictly abide by the terms of your housing licence
- If you have worked in Guernsey before this will be a consideration for Housing Control in determining the length of a new licence.
- Housing Control may refuse to grant housing licences to people with a criminal record.
